

#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2012-2013



It is indeed a great pleasure to present before you the 27th annual report of Ponda Eduation Society. Shri. Ravi S. Naik College of Arts & Science.

In the current academic year our enrolment was 839 students, 199 boys (23%) and 640 girls (77%).

The performance of our students at the B.A./B.Sc. University Examination has been excellent, commendable at T.Y.B.A. with 3 Distinctions. 25 First Classes, 60 Second Classes and 26 Pass Classes. The College Pass Percentage was 77.02%.

At T.Y.B.Sc. we had 54 Distinctions, 52 First Classes, 1 Second Class and 09 Pass Classes. College Pass Percentage was 93.54%.

This academic performance could not have been achieved without highly qualified and able and dedicated faculty members both in the Arts as well as Science section. It is a matter of pride for me to mention that our college has total number of 47 teachers out of which 27 Ph.D. holders and 15 M.PhiI. To mention this year

(तैत्तिरीय उपनिषद् - शिक्षावल्ल - अनुवाक ११)

ब्रह्मचर्चाश्रमाचे विधिनियम पाळून, गुरूकुलामध्यें वेदाध्ययन पूर्ण करून, समस्त समाजव्यवस्थेचा आधार अशा गृहस्थाश्रमामध्यें पदार्पण करण्यासाठी स्वगृही परतणाऱ्या विद्यार्थी युवकाला आचार्यांनीं मावी आयुष्यक्रमासाठीं केलेला उपदेश -

१. सत्य बोल (सत्य म्हणजे सर्व जीविहत कारक) न्यायनीतीने वाग सतत वेदिवचार करण्यास विसर्क नकोस आचार्यांना प्रिय होईल तें धन देऊन कृतज्ञ राहा. वंशवेल खंडूं नकोस (संततीच्या द्वारा रक्तवंश आणि विद्यादानाच्या द्वारा विद्यावंश परंपरा अखंड चालू ठेव).

2. सत्यापासून चळूं नकोस. न्यायनीतीसदाचरणापासून ढळूं नकोस. आरोग्य संभाळण्यांत दक्ष राहा. कर्तव्यपूर्तीसाठी आवश्यक तें धनार्जन करण्यास कचरूं नकोस. वेदिवचारांचा अभ्यास व प्रवचन टाळूं नकोस. देव कार्य व पितृकार्य करण्यात चुळूं नकोस. (देव जशी आपल्यावर सतत दयामाचा कृपा करतो तशीच आपण सर्वांवर करणे हे देवकार्य आणि आपण पितरांच्या कर्तृत्वाच्या खांद्यावर उमे आहोत याचें भान राखून पितरांप्रित कृतज्ञ राहून त्यांचा गौरव वाढेल असें कर्तृत्व करणें हे पितृकार्य).

3. देव म्हणजे सतत सुसंस्कारांचा प्रकाश देणारे - पहिली माता - आई, कारण ती आपल्यावर गर्भावस्थेपासून संस्कार करते. दुसरे पिता. तिसरे आचार्य गुरूजन आणि चवथे अतिथि (म्हणजे अनाहूतपणें संस्कार करणारे समाजांतील अनेकानेक लोक) यांची जीं अनिंद्य म्हणजेच स्तुत्यचांगली कर्मे असतील त्यांचेंच अनुकरण करावे, इतरांचें नहे. आमची जीं सुकृतें असतील त्यांचेंच अनुकरण करावे, इतरांचें नहे. आमच्यासारखेच किंवा आमच्याहूनही अधिक हितकारक श्रेष्ठ जन असतील त्यांचाही उचित मानसनमान

करावा - त्यांच्याही सुचरिताचें अनुकरण करावे. ४. श्रध्दा पूर्वक द्यावें अश्रध्दा असेल तर दानच करूं नरो. ऐपतीनुसार द्यावें (दुस-याशी स्पर्धा करण्यासाठी किंवा कुरघोडी करण्यासाठी देऊ नये). लाजेने द्यावें (आपल्यासारस्वा कर्तृत्वावान् मिळवता पोशिंता असतांना आपल्याच समाज बांधवांवर भिकेची लाचारी यावी याची लाज बाळगून द्यावें) भयाने द्यावें. (याने जनमजनमांतरीं कोणालाही कांहींही दिलेलें नाही, म्हणून याच्यावर भिकेची पाळी आली आहे; तशी माझ्यावर कधीही चेऊ नचे चा भीतीने द्यावें) संपूर्ण विचाराने द्यावें - सारासार विचार करून द्यांवें (सापाला दूध पाजल्यास विष होते, तशी दुर्जनास मदत केल्यास त्याच्या दुष्कृत्यांत सहभाग होतो. गरजेशिवाय गरजेबाहेर दिल्यास घेणाऱ्याला भिकेवर जगण्याची नादानी शिक्वल्याचें पाप लागतें. व्यसनी माणसाला दिल्यास व्यसनाला साहरा करून नाशाला कारणीभूत झाल्याचे पाप लागतें. एवढा विचार करून केवळ गरजवंताला आणि गरज भागण्या पुरतेच द्यावें. दिलेल्याची जाहिरात करूं नये. उजव्या हाताने दिलेलें डाव्या हातालाही कळूं नचे.)

६. हा आदेश - हाच उपदेश - हेंच वेदांचें रहस्यपूर्ण मानवजीवनशास्त्र हीच मानवसंस्कृति - याचीचा उपासना करावी - आचरण करावें.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The academic year began on June 18, 2012. As usual the results of the economics students at the T.Y.B.A. (Semester - VI) Examination held in April/May 2012 were good. The overall pass percentage of economics students in the above said examination was 86.41 per cent.

There were three first classes. Ms. Heena Gawde secured the highest marks in the subject of economics among the students of the department and as such she won the cash award instituted by the teachers of the department of economics (Mr. A. V. Bhandiwad and Dr. J. G. R. Monteiro)

The total strength of students in the subject of economics was 154. The semester wise break-up of students was as follows: Semester I and II, 72, Semester III and IV. 60, and Semester V and VI, 22. The students of economics are always encouraged to take up projects at the T.Y.B.A on current topics. We had two project reports prepared by nine students under the supervision and guidance of Mr. A. V. Bhandiwad and Dr. J. G. R. Monteiro. The titles were 1) Public Finance of Goa Government: An Analysis of Schemes. 2) An Economic Study of Sanjivani Cooperative Sugar Mill, Dayanandnagar, Dharbandora Goa.

The faculty of the department are actively involved in various academic activities. Mr. A. V. Bhandiwad attended the 95th Annual Conference of Indian Economic

Association at Visakhapatnam, from 27 December to 29th December, 2012. Both Mr. A. V. Bhandiwad and Dr. J. G. R. Monteiro are the life members of Indian Economic Association.

Psychology is an enterprising field which offers wide topic coverage in the systematic understanding of human behavior. It seeks to enrich the students and encompass them with vast knowledge and equips them with a clear, informative, and challenging perspective towards human behavior.

The Department of Psychology offers subjects like Fundamentals of Psychology, Child Psychology, Social Psychology, Adolescent Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, Organizational Behavior, Criminal Psychology and Statistics.

In the academic year 2012-2013, we had a total enrollment number of 49 students who opted for Psychology in the Ist Semester. This reinforces our belief that there is an increasing trend in students opting for Psychology. The total pass percentage for this academic year was 93.54%

The Department faculty includes:

Prof. Priya U Sabnis, Head of Psychology Department. She awards a subject prize annually to the student obtaining the highest marks in Psychology at the TYBA examination. This year the prize was awarded to Pooja S. Raikar.

Prof. Alvita de Souza, Assistant Professor in Psychology attended a one day workshop with 23 students at G.V.M.'s College of Commerce and Economics. The workshop was entitled 'Suicide and its Prevention in Adolescents' and was held on the 6th of September 2012. The 2nd local field trip for the F.Y. B.Sc. & S.Y. B.Sc. was arranged at Satpal Arboratum, Sacorda on 10/02/2013. An Arboratum an exsitu method of Biodiversity conservation where the woody tree sps. one maintained in separate plots.

The S.Y.B.Sc. Botany long trip was arranged at Amboli and Vengurla from 22/

11/12 to 24/11/12. On 22/11/12 they visited Regional Fruit Research Centre, Vengurla. At Amboli they studied the Flora through their visits to Mahadevgad, Hiranyakeshi and Kavlesad Points and the Garden with Medicinal Plants.

#### Visit to Satpal Arboratum, Sacorda, Goa

On 10th of February, the Botany Department of P.E.S. College organized a local study field trip to Satpal Arboratum at Sacorda. Students were accompanied by Dr. P. Bhattacharya, Mrs. Ranjita Sawaikar, Mrs. Bhagyashri Halankar, Mrs. Lynette Fernandes and Dr. Rupali Bhandari.

Arboretum is an excellent method of Bio-Diversity conservation. This is a place where woody and dirrerent types of plants are protected. Ms. Dakshta Lambor, the Forest Officer, briefed on the plantation present in the Arboretum. Arboretum is also used for research purpose in the field of Botany. Further she informed about different plots used for raising different plant species. She informed about six different species of bamboo. Later, we were introduced to different plots used for raising different types of timber fielding, medicinal, fumitories & masticatories, fibre yielding, spice yielding plants etc.

## Visit to West Coast Paper Mill Dandeli (Karnataka)

A visit to one of the oldest and known Paper Manufacturing Unit of India is the West Coast Paper Mill of Dandeli located near the Kali River in the lush green forest of the Western Ghats was organized by the Industrial Chemistry Unit of the Chemistry Department of our College on 21st February, 2013. This factory is owned by Bhangur family of Marwar of Western Rajasthan. There were total 29 students and 05 staff members (Botany Teacher Dr. P. Bhattacharya, Micro-Biology Teacher Dr. Sunita Borkar and three Teachers of the Chemistry Dept., Viz. Dr. S. D. Gokakakar, Dr. B. L. Malik and Shri V. S. Dangui.

The group left for Dandeli on 21st February 2013 by hiring a private bus at 12.00 noon and reached at Dandeli at 7.00 pm. Our stay was arranged there in a Guest House which was earlier used by the officers of the West Coast Paper Mill. Next day, They all directly went to the Mill after having Breakfast in a Hotel. Then, names were registered at the Paper Mill and were provided with a Helmet with a provision of a Torch, One, Mr. Sheikh, PRO (Public Relation Officer), was deputed for the group to show the various sections in the Paper Mill. They were informed not to click any photograph at any of these sections, not even using a cell phone. They were informed about-

Raw materials, Waste papers,

Wood Pulp Preparation - namely,

- 1) Mechanical,
- 2) Chemical,
- 3) Semi-Chemical.

They were also shown and informed about

Bleaching,

Washing,

Beating,

Sizing and Loading process.

Dr. William Carre is credited with laying the foundations of the Modern Paper Industry in India. In 1866, Bally Paper Mill was established at the bank of the Hooghly River, near Kolkata. The first news printing Mill was started in 1947 at Napanagar, Madhya Pradesh.

The group was informed that the name "Paper" is derived from the word "Papyrus", a sheet made by pasting together these sections of an Egyptian reed (Lat. Cyperus Papyrus), the name of sedge. As early as 2400 B. C. the Egyptian used the pith of this sedge for making paper. However, the Chinese were the pioneers in the field of Paper Making and the oldest papyrus sheet can be traced back to nearly 5000 years. The highly cultured Aryan Civilization were using dried and processed palm leaves and thin bark sheets of "Betula utilis" commonly known as "Bhojpatra", The famous Indian Epics: Ramayana and Mahabharata were written in Bhojpatras. Straw and wood were tried in England and France as early as 1800, but, it was not until about the middle of the 19th Century that practical technique were developed for converting wood into wood pulp.

Later, in the afternoon time, the students were directed to the R & D Section of the Paper Mill, where they saw the pilot plant and the research activities going on there.

Finally, they came out from the Paper Mill and went to the Hydro Electric Ganesh Gudi Dam. This is under the

control of KSPC, Karnataka State Power Corporation. they were not allowed to go to the T-6 point as the Non Professional Colleges need a special permission from Bangalore to visit that point where there are six turbines (T-6 Points). They went to the sky point and could experience a wonderful site of the Dam surrounded by the Flora of the Western Ghats in the evening, we started for Goa and reachede late night.

### Visit to NCAOR - National Centre for Antarctic and Ocean Research

On Thursday, 11th April, 2013, we visited NCAOR, National Centre for Antarctic and Ocean Research, a centre under the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Govt. of India, located at Headland Sada, Vasco-Da-Gama Dr. P. Bhattacharya and Dr. Rupali Bhandari accompanied the group. Dr. M. V. Ramesh, the Scientist cum PRO, took them to the Auditorium and informed us about the functioning of the Research Centre with following aims and objectives:

- Undertake, aid, promote, guide and coordinate scientific research in the fields of Polar and Southern Ocean Sciences.
- Serve as a nodal agency responsible for the overall coordination and implementation of the Indian Antarctic and Arctic Programmes.
- Establish and maintain research base in Polar Regions and provide all operational and logistic support.
- Encourage multi-disciplinary and multi-institutional research both, at National and International levels,

- especially in the frontier areas of science, which have potential applications.
- Devise, formulate and initiate programmes, which will create knowledge base for future commercial and thematic interests of India in Antarctica, Arctic and the Southern Ocean.
- Effectively interact and liaison with ATCM, SCAR, COMNAP and other international bodies in order to keep the Indian Antarctic programmes abreast with international developments and top ensure a perceptible presence of India in global framework of nations in Antarctica.
- Extend a singular research Laboratory setup with such facilities which are of specialized nature or otherwise not easily accessible.
- Develop predictive models for dynamic processes controlled and driven by Antarctica and the surrounding oceans.
- Coordinate, address and monitor all environmental issues in Antarctica arising out of the Environmental Protocol.
- Develop a complete database inventory and repository (National Antarctic Data centre) for Antarctic and Arctic Science and logistics including a polar museum and a library.
- Provide fertile platform to generate specialized human resource

capabilities for polar science and through logistics training, fellowships, awards, workshops, publications and exchange of scientists, etc., both at national and international levels.

- Cruise planning and management of the oceanographic research vessels engaged by the Ministry of Earth Sciences and the NCAOR.
- Take up other scientific and technological projects of the Ministry of Earth Sciences when entrusted.

The Laboratory, also, has the following facilities in their instrumentation section viz;

#### **RED RIBBON CLUB**

The Red Ribbon Club is a voluntary on-campus intervention Programme for Students in Educational Institutions. It is initiated and supported by State AIDS Control Society (SACS) and implemented through multi-sectoral collaboration, particularly, using services of cadre officers of State's National Service Scheme.

India is, perhaps, the second largest country after South Africa with innumerable people suffering from HIV / AIDS infection. This HIV / AIDS epidemic is now one of the most serious health problems in India and there has been steady rise every year. It is reaching an alarming figure. There was a time when in India, people died because of mal-nutrition. It is really very difficult to forget the famine of Bengal in 1870 and then in 1942, when crores of people were found affected with 90 Lacs people dead. Prof. Amartya Sen and Anthropologist Prof. T. C. Das of Kolkata University have given independent view in recent past on this aspect. The trauma of famine is over long back. We have fought this demon bravely. In fact, man is leading a very happy go lucky life as compared to those days. But, the situation still remains quite grave as every day a number of

people dying due to Moral Famine i.e. severe scarcity of Ethical Values and also, due to the negligence. The irony of the situation is this that there is substantial food to curb the hunger, but, there is either no or very scanty eminities to curb the curse of HIV / AIDS in spite of continuous efforts of organizations like NACO (National Aids Control Organization), SACS (State Aids Control Society). It is indeed shameful. Today man is not dying because of hunger; he is dying because of low body resistance power. Yes, the AIDS virus is slowly destroying the body organs and stopping the total machinery to a sudden halt.

In association with Goa State AIDS Control Society (SACS), the Red Ribbon Club was established in P. E. S.'s S. R. S. N. College of Arts & Science, Farmagudi-Goa on Friday, 1st February, 2013 at 11.00 a.m. in Swami Vivekanand Sabhagruha. Programme was attended by almost 300 students, members of SACS, management members of P. E. S. and the Principal. The dignitaries from Goa State AIDS Control Society who were present were Mr. Umakant Sawant, Dy. Director (IEC), Ms. Jeunesse D. Fernandes, Consultant (Youth Affairs) and Dr. Nutan Dev, Health Officer, Community Health

Centre, Ponda-Goa. The Chief Guest for the function was Shri R. G. Desai, Treasurer, Ponda Education Society.

The guests were escorted to the dais by the Convenor, Red Ribbon Club. The formal welcome and introduction of the dignitaries was done by Principal, Dr. Anil Dinge. The Programme started with an invocation song presented by Ms. Shambhavi Ghaisas and group.

The formal welcome followed lighting of the lamp by the dignitaries with RRC, Advisory Committee, Convenor and 2 student members, Mr. Vijendra Kavalekar and Ms. Ravina Jalmi.

Ms. Jeunesse Femandes, Consultant, Youth Affairs, Goa SACS, talked on importance of Red Ribbon Club and RRC activities.

Key-note Speakers for the function was Dr. Nutan Dev, who spoke of the HIV / AIDS, Modes of Transmission, Prevention Stratgies, Care and Support, Treatment and Basic Services, etc. She informed that a person can transmit the virus even when he/she seems apparently healthy and shows no symptoms. Many infected persons may not show symptoms for years. But, over a period of time, the immune system weakens. The T-Cell count falls, and the person is said to have AIDS, when the count is below 200 per cubic mililitre of blood.

This makes it easier for infections to set in. AIDS is the final stage of the HIV infection. In some persons, it can take up to 10 years after the initial infection for the disease to set in.

The audience was enlightened by two poetry recitations in Hindi on AIDS by the Convenor, Dr. P. Bhattacharya. The programme was compered by Ms. Lynette Femandes and vote of thanks by Ms. Deepa Femandes.


Our students pressented programme at "Yuvavani" on All India Radio, Panaji, Goa.

## "PABLO PICASSO": The making of an Artist.

spent his adult life mostly in France. He was an all rounder genius who possessed the skills of the painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist and stage designer. He is credited with co-founding of the Cubist Movement, invention of the constructed sculpture and the co-invention of collage. He is well known for development of wide a variety of styles.

Picasso's famous works include the proto—Cubist les Demoiselles d'Avignon (1907) and Guernica (1937). This was the portrayal of the German bombing of Guernica during the Spanish World War. He was the most renowned artist who defined the revolutionary developments in Plastic arts along with Henry Matisse and Marcel Duchamp at the opening decades of the 20th century. Picasso's talent of painting in a realistic manner was unleashed during his childhood and

adolescence. In the beginning of the 20th century, by experimenting with different theories, techniques and ideas, he completely changed his style, which brought him the ultimate fame and fortune.

## "Art is a lie that makes us realize the Truth"

As a prolific draftsman, sculptor and printmaker Picasso considered panting as his primary medium and he used his imagination or memory as a base for painting. Picasso used common house paint in many of his painting which was confirmed by physicists at Argonne National Laboratory in 2012 from his painting 'The Red Armchair' (1931).

## Picasso's work is categorized into the following periods:

- Before 1901
- Blue period (1901-1904)
- Rose period (1905- 1907)
- African-influenced Period (1908-1909)
- Analytic Cubism (1909-1912)
- Synthetic Cubism (1912-1919)

#### **&** Before 1901

Picasso as a child was trained by his father before 1890. His progress in

panting is evident from the collection of his early works displayed at the Museu Picasso in Barcelona. He began his career as a painter in 1894. His most dynamic paintings which marked the beginning of his career were The First Communion (1896), Portrait of Aunt Pepa which he painted at the age of 14 years.


#### **Blue period (1901-1904)**



In search for f a m e Picasso and his friend Carles Casagemas moved to Paris. A year later Casagemas committed suicide as a result of

his failed affairs. This event depressed Picasso deeply and as he was poor the situations compelled him to identify and relate himself to the beggars, prostitutes, and the downtrodden in society. These event and circumstances marked the beginning of Picasso's Blue Period in 1901, which lasted till 1904. The period is highlighted by flat expanses of blue, grey, and black, melancholy figures suffering from poverty and humiliations from society. The most notorious of his work during this period was The Old Guitarist – an oil painting depicting an old, blind, haggard man in rags weakly hunched over his guitar. Picasso's poor standard of living and the suicide of his

dear friend greatly influenced his style, which came to be known as the Blue Period.

colors and featuring circus people, acrobats and harlequins of France. It was during this time that Picasso met Fernande Olivier, a model for sculptors and artists, in Paris in 1904. The paintings of this period are influenced by his warm relationship with Fernande Olivier.

The development of formal ideas directly

led to the formation of the Cubist Period that followed this period.

#### Cubism



The style of painting also called 'Analytical Cubism' was co-developed by Picasso along with George Braque. Monochrome brownish and neutral colors were used by taking apart objects and analyzing them in terms of their shapes differently by the artist.

The further development in this style developed Synthetic Cubism. In this form the cut paper fragments were pasted into compositions which marked the first use of collage in fine art.

#### Classicism and surrealism



After the upheaval of World War-I Picasso produced work in a neoclassical style. During the 1930s the Harlequin which was a common motif in his work was replaced by the minotaur which came partly from his contact with the surrealistic who used it as their symbol.

Picasso's most notable and famous work is his depiction of the German bombing of Guernica during the Spanish civil war-Guernica. He depicted successfully on a large canvas the inhumanity, brutality and hopelessness of war.

As said by Picasso "It isn't up to the painter to define the symbols otherwise it would be better if he wrote them out in so many words, the public who look at the picture must interpret the symbols as they understand them". It is very true in the case of his painting.......

### **ARYABHATTA**: A great Indian Mathematician

In dian Scientists have shaped the course of mathematics and astronomy for the world to marvel upon. Many Scientists in the U.S.A. today are Indians and more than 40% of Scientists

of NASA and the Silicon Valley are Indians. Indians have helped the world build intercontinental missiles, Satellites, the space Shuttle, stealth technology, space exploration and Deep Impact navigation. One of the very early pioneers in astronomy and mathematics was Aryabhatta.

Aryabhatta was born 476 A.D. in Pataliputra in Magadha is now modern Patna in Bihar. There are several tales of claim for his origins. Many believe that he was born in the South of India around the Kerala region and lived in Magadha at the time of the Gupta rulers, time which is known as the Golden age of India. There is no evidence that he was born outside Patliputra and traveled to Magadha, the centre of instruction, culture and Knowledge for his studies where he even set up a coaching institute. His first name "Arya" is not a South Indian name while "Bhatt" for Sometimes (Bhatta) is a

typical north Indian name. The name is popular even today in India especially among the trader community of North India.

Whatever this origins, it cannot be disputed that he lived in Pataliputra where



he wrote his famous thesis called the "Aryabhatta" which was commonly known as the "Aryabhatta Siddhanta." This is the only work to have survived to the present day. It contains mathematical and astronomical hypothesis that have been discovered to be quite accurate in contemporary mathematics. For example, he wrote that if 4 is added to 100 and then multiplied by 8 then added to 62,000 then divided by 20,000 the answer will be equal to the circumference of a circle of diameter twenty thousand. This calculates to 3.1416 close to the actual value Pi (3.14159). But his greatest donation has to be zero, known as the "Shunya" in his times. His other works include theorems on trigonometry arithmetic, algebera, quadratic equations and the sine table.
